




Since its inception in 2015, CYAP has matured into a vital resource for youth in our community. We serve as an early intervention advocate for youth ages 3-17 who are facing challenging life circumstances. CASE MANAGEMENT

What is case management?

Beyond individual support, Early Intervention Advocates (EIAs) for youth play a crucial role in fostering and strengthening partnerships with local organizations—such as schools, community groups, businesses, volunteers, donors, and service agencies. These connections enable advocates to offer youth a comprehensive support network and access to essential services, often developing new resources when needed. We work with parents and caregivers to ensure they are connected to resources in the community that meet their specific needs while reducing barriers along the way. Our EIAs are dedicated to ensuring that youth and their families receive the tailored support necessary to overcome challenges and achieve long-term success.

MENTORING

What is mentoring?

CYAP's mentoring program is designed to give Carmel youth a fun, consistent, positive adult relationship. Mentors and mentees focus on building a relationship, having fun and learning from one another. Mentors are matched with one child and are expected to see the child once a week for at least one year. Mentees vary in age but are typically between 4th grade and 10th grade. Mentees have been identified by CYAP as needing a positive adult in their life.

What is tutoring?

CYAP offers two tutoring programs: Summer Bridge and 1-1 tutoring. The focus of CYAP's Summer Bridge Tutoring Program is to mitigate summer learning loss. Youth in grades K-4 meet one-on-one with their tutor twice weekly to work on reading and math skills. CYAP's 1-1 Tutoring Program takes place during the school year and focuses on improving a student's understanding/learning in a specific class. In this program, matches focus on re-teaching and homework completion.

HIGHLIGHTS



CARMEL GALA

Raised an amazing **\$100,000** at the 2024 Carmel Gala. We take immense pride in the fact that every dollar raised is allocated directly to supporting our programs and furthering our mission to empower youth.

TUTORING PROGRAM

Enhanced our one-on-one tutoring program which experienced significant growth this year. Our dedicated tutors not only provided academic support but also helped youth recognize their full potential. We are proud to have **matched 22 youth with tutors**, marking our most successful year to date

HOLIDAY SUPPORT

Supported 60 individuals for the holiday season thanks to our partnerships with Carmel High School's "Care to Share" Student Senate, TriKappa, The Salvation Army, Hamilton County Sheriff's Office, Carmel Police Department, Secret Families of Hamilton County, and the Good Samaritan Network of Hamilton County. Many generous individuals, families and local companies also sponsored children.

GRANTS AND GIVING

Secured over \$200,000 in grant funds and raised more than \$10,000 through our Mental Health Day of Giving and Giving Tuesday campaigns.

NEW TEAM MEMBERS

Welcomed two new team members to our office. The **Program Coordinator**, who plays a vital role in overseeing our mentoring and tutoring programs, and the **Advancement Coordinator**, who contributes significantly to strengthening our outreach efforts and fostering meaningful connections with our supporters.

MCKINNEY VENTO COLLABORATION

Completed a 2 year grant partnership with Carmel Clay Schools to better serve the population of students in Carmel who have been identified as homeless and are protected through the McKinney-Vento Act. During the 2023-2024 school year, Carmel Clay Schools had 163 students identified as homeless. CYAP was able to use grant funds to provide services to these families such as tutoring, after school care, and transportation.



2024 SPOTLIGHT

COHEN FAMILY FOUNDATION

Carmel Youth Assistance Program (CYAP) received an incredibly generous **\$200,000** grant from the Alan and Linda Cohen Family Foundation to launch a new transportation program that will support local families.

Since CYAP's inception in 2015, Early Intervention Advocates who work directly with families have observed a recurring challenge among its clients: lack of access to reliable transportation. Carmel has been without public transportation since Indy Express stopped serving the city in late 2016.

Access to reliable transportation is a critical barrier for families, and often the missing piece to success and self-sufficiency. The negative implications of not having reliable transportation are significant for children and caregivers. Lack of access to transportation affects a family's economic stability, mental and physical health, educational opportunities, and social and community integration.

CYAP is immensely grateful to the Alan and Linda Cohen Family Foundation for also recognizing this need and partnering with CYAP families and provide solutions to these challenges.

With the investment from the Alan and Linda Cohen Family Foundation, CYAP aims to enhance its impact on transportation challenges, facilitating broader access and removing obstacles for local families. Carmel Youth Assistance Program seeks to enable access to mental health services and pro-social activities like camps, sports, and clubs, while also addressing summer learning loss through educational opportunities during breaks. With this support from the Cohen Family Foundation, CYAP will ensure youth have more access to these services.

The Alan and Linda Cohen Family Foundation was formed in 1997 and is a private foundation located in Carmel, IN. The Foundation primarily funds to support operating expenses for its grantees.

10 YEAR ANNIVERSARY FOR CYAP

We are so excited to be celebrating our 10 year anniversary in 2025. Over the past decade, we have strived to fill community gaps through providing meaningful support. We have worked tirelessly with our community partners to strengthen youth and families in various ways including creating a summer meals program which is now sustained through the Merciful HELP Center, creating an in-house tutoring program, and working with hundreds of families through the years. As we continue to grow, we look forward to ever-evolving community needs.

Since our inception in 2015, CYAP has:

- received 1.288 referrals
- partnered with more than 70 organizations and groups to meet youth needs
- provided over 142,250 through the Carmel Summer Meals program
- invested \$402,780 in mentoring, tutoring, pro-social activities, financial assistance, clothing, shoes, food, mental health, and medical/dental support for youth
- raised \$1,252,605 to support our programs

TRANSPORTATION PROGRAM

There is a shortage of affordable transportation options in Hamilton County making it hard for individuals and families to get to and from work, medical appointments, and school. Together, we are networking with local car dealerships and donors to give our families better access to those needs. Families in need of a car will complete a mandatory course, run by partners and volunteers, covering car insurance, maintenance, basic repairs, budgeting, and future resources. Upon finishing the course, clients will receive a used car purchased by CYAP from one of our pre-established dealerships.

FALL EVENT

For the first time, we're thrilled to be adding a second event to our calendar in 2025. This exciting new gathering will be a special opportunity to celebrate and connect with our wonderful families, partners, donors, and volunteers. We can't wait to bring everyone together for a fun-filled day of appreciation, sharing, and building stronger connections. It's a chance to not only say thank you, but also to look forward to the incredible impact we'll continue to make together in the future!
